INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Background Information Document (BID) is to provide all interested and affected parties (I&APs) with information about the development of the Rietfontein Solar PV Plant in Limpopo Province. In addition to the aforesaid, the BID aims to:

- Introduce and explain the Scoping and Environmental Impact Assessment (S&EIA) process as well as other related parallel environmental processes;
- Introduce and explain the public participation process which is prescribed by the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA);
- Invite all I&APs to comment on:
 - o The ecological, physical, socio- economic aspects of the project as well as any other issues of concern;
 - o The proposed public participation and environmental assessment process, and
 - o Any other suggestions which might be of relevance

The EMP describes the goals and objectives for environmental management to minimise or eliminate the potential environmental impacts, the action plans to bring effect to those goals and objectives, the procedures to be implemented to ensure integration of environmental management into the daily operations, as well as a plan to raise awareness of employees and the surrounding community with regards to environmental management.

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BACKGROUND

Cullinan Fourways Properties (Pty) Ltd proposes to develop a Photovoltaic power plant and associated infrastructure on farm Rietfontein no.360, in the Lephalale Local Municipality, of the broader Waterberg District Municipality, Limpopo province. The proposed development land area is +/- 196 hectares and comprises of a Solar PV farm with an output of 200MW output.

The typical components associated with Solar PV Farms include:

- Solar field/arrays
- Internal service roads
- Internal underground (where possible) reticulation (i.e., low medium voltage lines up to 33kV)
- Perimeter fencing
- Auxiliary buildings (including, but not limited to, O&M buildings, admin, workshop, gatehouse, security, control centre, offices, warehouses, etc.)
- Backup water storage tank minimum of 500Litres 3Million Litres (borehole fed water)

PROJECT LOCATION

The project aims to establish the solar farm on farm Rietfontein no. 360, in the Lephalale Local Municipality, of the broader Waterberg District Municipality, Limpopo province. The Rietfontein farm is located approximately 60km South West of Lephalale along the R510. The project area covers an area of approximately 196 hectares in total. The locality map for the proposed project is indicated below.




Figure 1: Locality Map of the proposed Rietfontein Solar PV project Site.





PROPOSED SPECIALIST INVESTIGATIONS

The specialist investigations identified below are in the process of being undertaken for the proposed development (in terms of the NEMA). These have been listed below:

- Socio Economic Impact
- Terrestrial Biodiversity Impact Assessment
- Aquatic and Wetland Impact Assessment
- Visual and Landscape Impact Assessment
- Avifauna Impact Assessment
- Heritage/Paleontological Impact Assessment

REGULATORY CONTEXT

The NWA stipulates that, activities which have the potential to impact on a water resource require that a water use licence be issued by the DWS. General Authorization is an authorization to use water without a licence, provided that the water use is within certain limits and complies with conditions set out in the Gazetted General Authorisation. This authorization requires a registration with the Department prior to exercising the water use(s).

In accordance with the requirements of the NWA, a water use license will be compiled and submitted to the DWS to ensure the legality of the identified water uses associated with the proposed development.

The following environmental authorisation processes will be undertaken for the Solar Farm development.

- Environmental Authorization in terms of the NEMA (DFFE Ref No. 2024-01-0028); and
- General Authorisation in terms of the NWA (Ref No. XXX).

The regulatory context for the proposed project is summarized in Table 2 below. The table identifies the listed activities that will require environmental authorisation in terms of the NEMA and the National Water Act.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

Public involvement is an essential part of any environmental assessment process. All comments will be recorded in the CRR and presented to the project team and regulatory authorities. You will receive feedback on how your comments have been considered and the outcome of the assessment.

I&APs include any person who will be directly or indirectly involved and/or affected by the project. To be recognized as an I&AP one must register with Minds Alike Consultants to be added to the stakeholder database for the project and may communicate via fax, email or telephone to obtain further information or comment on the proposed project.
